Items Provided

Dormitory rooms are double occupancy with drapes and 2 closets. A desk, full dresser with a mirror and standard twin beds and bulletin boards are provided for each student in the room. Two students per room.

Items Needed

- Bible
- Bedding—mattress pad, pillow, linens (standard twin sheets, pillowcases), blanket, bedspread or comforter
- Towels and washcloths
- Personal items, toiletries (soap, deodorant, shampoo, Kleenex, toothbrush, toothpaste)
- Shower caddy, shower shoes (flip flops)
- Alarm clock (with battery powered backup system)
- Laundry supplies—basket, detergent, fabric softener, hangers
- Quarters will be needed for the laundry machine and vending machines
- School supplies—3 ring binder, notepaper, notebooks, pens, pencils, highlighters, backpack, calculator etc.
- Basic desk/health supplies—tape, stapler, pens, erasers, pencil sharpener, jump drive/thumb drive, Band-Aids etc.
- 3 prong Adaptors (plug ins - 2 or 3)
- Electrical power strip extension cords
- Waste Basket and liners
- Umbrella/rain jacket
- Clothes (See dress code in the Student Handbook)
- Wall decorations and plastic tack to hang items, push pins for bulletin board and door memo board.

Optional Items

- Brief Holt Handbook
- Stereo (larger than shelf size needs to be cleared with the Resident Hall Supervisor before putting it into the room)
- Computer, Kindle or Nook and their cords
- Floor Rugs (must to be cleared with the Resident Hall Supervisor.) Wall-to-wall carpet is not permitted.

Optional Items Continued:

- Oscillating fan
- Iron, small ironing board
- Coffeepot
- Plate, glass, cup, bowl, dinner knife, fork and spoon for dorm snacks
- Stationary/stamps
- Bicycle with lock
- Lap desk
- Sealed containers for snacks
- Cell phone, phone calling card
- Small lock box with 2 keys (Resident Hall Director keeps one key)
- Dorm sized refrigerator not to exceed 2.0 cubic feet. Limit one per room. There is a \$25 per semester electrical charge for use of the refrigerator.
- Fish, in small bowl are permitted (with approval.)

Do Not Bring the Following

- Televisions or VCR/DVD players
- Hotplates or hotpots
- Pets
- Fireworks
- Street or traffic signs
- Sunlamps
- Space heaters
- Couch or stuffed chair
- Barbells, weights, chinning bars
- Candle, incense
- Posters involving alcohol, tobacco, drugs, sex, violence, racist organizations or bad language.

Clothing and Dress Code Outline

Saint Paul students take pride in their appearance. Our students exercise their Christian freedom and responsibility by dressing in ways that reflect their love for Christ by their understanding of the sensitivity of others. Christian modesty is expected of all our students. **The following are examples of things that may be worn during the academic day.** For a complete listing of Saint Paul Lutheran High dress code requirements see the Student Handbook. Regular Dress Code

- **Clothes will be clean, in good condition, hemmed, and fit properly.**
- **Hemmed shorts and skirts must be mid-length or longer.**
- **Shoes and sandals are appropriate for school. Other types of footwear are not appropriate for school.**
- **Shirts and shoes are to be worn in all buildings. Sunglasses, caps, hats, bandanas or other head-coverings are not to be worn in the academic buildings, chapel or dining hall.**
- **Jerseys with the following stipulations would be permissible during the academic day.**
 - No sleeveless jerseys**
 - All jerseys must be tucked in.**
 - T-shirts must be worn under all mesh type attire**

Wednesday/Sunday Church Apparel & other announced Special Days

Females

- Dress slacks, capris, blouses, skirts and dresses are appropriate attire for females. **No tight leggings** with long tops or short dresses are allowed.
- Blouses, shirts (Ladies tops must be long enough to cover the waistband of a skirt or pants while sitting.) Tops must be modest and cover breasts. Cleavage should not be visible.

Males

- Dress slacks/pants with belts, collared dress shirts, tucked into slacks/pants. Ties are optional and appropriate attire for males. Jackets and sweaters also are optional.

Guidelines for females and males

- Dress shoes (no athletic shoes on Wednesday)
- No screen-printed shirts should be worn. Any logo or emblem should be small (not larger than a student ID)
- Jeans of *any style or color*, shorts, T-shirts & sweatshirts are not permissible on Wednesdays.

Additional Dress Code Guidelines

All students are expected to maintain a clean and neat appearance, this includes the academic and non-academic school hours.

- Boys are **not** to wear baggy or slouchy clothing.
- Girls are **not** to wear clothing that is too tight or revealing.
- Stomach skin or low cut tops are not allowed. Any shirt or top too short to be tucked in or which does not cover the waist/back while seated or when a student raises his/her hand is inappropriate and should not be worn. Shirts and tops should be buttoned within one or two buttons from the top. Ladies may not wear short dresses/skirts with leggings.
- Clothing which is immodest, sexually suggestive, or advertises alcohol, tobacco, drugs, or a non-Christian points of view are inappropriate at any time.
- Work clothes, grubbies, halter or tube tops, tank tops, surgical pant tops, see-through mesh tops, sweat suits, bare midriff outfits, armed services or look alikes, combat boots, spandex and biker shorts are inappropriate attire at Saint Paul.

Earrings

Since body piercing is not permitted, ladies are limited to earrings worn on the earlobe only. Males wearing of earrings is forbidden, at all times.

Tattoos

Visible tattoos are not acceptable.

Hair Styles

- Bizarre, extreme, or unusual hair colors or styles are not permitted for any student.
- Men are not to have ponytails, braids, beards, goatees, mustaches, or sideburns below the earlobe. Hair should not hang over student's eyes or extend beyond the top of the collar of a collared shirt (mid-ear length).

Final decisions regarding individual hairstyles will be made by the Assistant Principal.
